Get Involved

Gain experience outside of your job responsibilities

If the answer is "yes," volunteering may be the answer. Let's say you want to move into a management role but have no experience with budgets. Working on the chapter finance committee or even as treasurer may be just what you need to fill that gap.

Enrich yourself personally

Experiences like organizing or coordinating an event for the district or chapter will help you grow personally and will help a cause you care about. It will also show your employer that you're well-rounded and interested in using your skills to help others.

Become a mentor of a student or new graduate
